Educators Responsibilities

- The preschool has emergency instructions and evacuation floor plans. These are displayed near exits and shown and explained to educators on induction.
- A risk assessment is conducted every year to assess the likelihood of incidents at the preschool.
- Emergency evacuation and invacuation drills are carried out regularly at the preschool (each term). These are evaluated and logged in the 'Invacuation / Evacuation Practices Record Sheet' located in the 'Records and Checklists' folder located in the preschool office.
- WHS policies and procedures are followed in the preschool.
- Emergency phone contacts are located near all phones.
