Dear Families

As we are now heading towards the end of winter, we will soon see the weather warming up and it is probably a good time to dust off your child's **school hats ready for Week 6** in a fortnight.



Attendance

Absences are recorded on student reports and it is very important that children are at school unless they are sick or have a valid reason to be away. It is vital that all students attend and engage with the learning opportunities offered in classrooms and by developing good attendance habits early, students are more likely to feel a sense of belonging to their school community. Good school attendance means children can achieve their learning goals, fulfill their potential and have better future opportunities.

Uniforms:

Please remember that all children should be wearing our school colours and if there are logos on clothing, they should be no bigger than a fifty-cent piece. Jumpers and jackets must be labelled with their names, in case they take them off and misplace them throughout the day. You will find a lost property rack in the courtyard for you to check should your child come home missing an item of clothing.

Pupil Free Day:

Our next Pupil Free Day is on Friday 1st September. During the day, teachers and SSOs will be undertaking professional development, where they will continue their learning journey around trauma informed practice.

School Closure Day:

Every year the school has a school closure day, which coincides with The Royal Adelaide Show. This year, our school closure day will be on *Monday 4th September*. No students or staff will be on site that day. OSHC is available but bookings are required.

Next week (Week 5) from 21st August until 25th August it is Book Week. Book Week Parade will be on Wednesday 23rd August and children are encouraged to come dressed as their favourite book

This will be a fun day and grandparents may wish to purchase books for their grandchildren on the day which will be for sale at our Book Fair, open from 8:30-9:00am and 11:00-11:30am. The Thriving Kids and Parents School Project:

Our school has registered to participate in the Australian Government funded 'Thriving Kids and Parents School Project'. This project has been approved by the Department of Education in South Australia. It is currently being rolled out in over 300 primary schools in Queensland, South Australia and Victoria.

All families will be invited to participate in three free online seminars on positive parenting in a few weeks. This project consists of high quality, evidenced based parenting programs to support parents and schools develop a shared language and a toolbox of strategies to support every child's learning and wellbeing.

These seminars will provide parents with strategies to:

- Guide their child's behaviour and develop their self-regulation
- Develop their child's emotional regulation and manage everyday anxiety
- Develop healthy peer relationships, build resilience and prevent bullying
