The Thriving Kids and Parents School Project:

Our school has registered to participate in the Australian Government funded 'Thriving Kids and Parents School Project'. This project has been approved by the Department of Education in South Australia. It is currently being rolled out in over 300 primary schools in Queensland, South Australia and Victoria.

All families will be invited to participate in three free online seminars on positive parenting in a few weeks. This project consists of high quality, evidenced based parenting programs to support parents and schools develop a shared language and a toolbox of strategies to support every child's learning and wellbeing.

These seminars will provide parents with strategies to:

- Guide their child's behaviour and develop their self-regulation
- Develop their child's emotional regulation and manage everyday anxiety
- Develop healthy peer relationships, build resilience and prevent bullying

Tournament of Minds



This year is the third year The Pines School has entered the very challenging Tournament of Minds (TOM) competition.

Tournament of Minds is an international challenge for primary and high school students. Students who participate in this competition work in teams of seven to solve demanding, real-world problems.

This year, two teams made up of Year 5/6 students represented our school in the STEM division of Tournament of Minds. Both our teams did an amazing job, working VERY hard on the challenge for six weeks.

This year's challenge required students to use their STEM skills to design and build a bird that could make two different flights using very limited materials. They also had to make a perch with a launch mechanism for the bird. To present their ideas, students develop a ten-minute play to present their ideas, including information about science, maths and the environment, while also telling a story to bring all their information together. Students researched, wrote a script, made costumes and props and rehearsed their play ready to present to a panel of judges. They also designed and built a bird and perch using their engineering skills. This actually meant they needed to build many birds, as they tried different ideas and designs to try and make a bird that would complete two different flight manoeuvres.

Sunday was Presentation Day at Adelaide High School. Our two TOM teams confidently presented their ideas and plays in front of TOM judges and an audience of family members and school staff.

It was a proud moment, watching our students perform so well after working on their challenge for the last six weeks. A big CONGRATULATIONS goes out to our TOM students this year and their teachers and families who supported their participation in this year's competition.
