CONSTRUCTION OF THE PINES SCHOOL GYMNASIUM

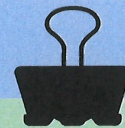
I enjoyed coding because there were lots of different challenges and they were lots of fun

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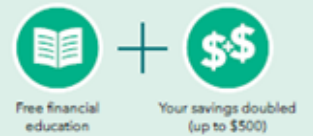


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Can I join Saver Plus?
