CONSTRUCTION OF THE PINES SCHOOL GYMNASIUM

This means that the gate used to enter and exit the school from Hemming Street, near the crossing, will be locked and cannot be used.

Parents and children can use the Morgan Street gate at the back of our oval. The OSHC gate and the Andrew Smith Drive gates can also be used to enter and leave the school.
