Leadership News

Welcome back to The Pines School for another year of fabulous learning. What an unusual start we have had this year. We began the year on Wednesday February 2nd with Reception and Year 1 students and a few students across all other year levels, whose parents or caregivers are essential workers.

This week we welcomed all students from Years 2 to 6 and what an absolute delight it has been to have our students back at school again. We also welcome new families to our school community and we wish them a settled and supported time with us.

On-line learning has certainly challenged some of us including teachers, parents and students and we know that being at school and interacting face to face with friends and teachers has many, many benefits. The leadership team is proud of the manner in which teachers adapted quickly to a model of online learning and face to face learning. We are equally as proud of students and families for managing on-line learning and in some cases having one child at school and one learning at home.

This year we welcome new staff to our school community. We have Mr Orphanou teaching Year 4 and 5 students in Room 35 and Miss Esther teaching the Reception students in Room 3. Miss Esther is on contract, replacing Ms Keryl who is at home looking after her new baby boy, Tate. We welcome back Miss Emma who is in Room 1, replacing Miss Van Loggem who is also at home with her little girl Lucy. Miss Schmidt is working on Wednesdays and Thursdays in Room 13 while Mrs Turnbull supports some class teachers with the development of literacy practice.

We have four new teachers in our Intensive English Language Program and they are: Ms Marites in Room 45, Mr Woolford in Room 11, Ms Jenny in Room 8 and Miss Lisa in Room 9. We also welcome Ms Kaur who has joined us from Colonel Light Gardens Primary School. We extend a special welcome to all our new staff members and we hope their time with us is happy and fulfilling. We know that they will do their very best for our students.

This term, our principal Mrs Collings is working at Elizabeth East Primary School each week from Wednesday to Friday and Mrs Girgolas will be Acting Principal at our school on those days.

Over the next few days class teachers will send home information about the term and will outline some of the requirements and structures of the year for their students.

Good relationships between home and school are vital for the development of confident and engaged students. To start each school year, teachers teach students a social emotional learning program called 'The Starting Block.' This is taught in every class to ensure consistency when setting expectations around behaviour and learning. It is also a good way to develop positive relationships between students and teachers.

This week Year 2-6 teachers will be focussing on our school values of:

Respect – caring for yourself, others(peers, friends, teachers) and our school

Belonging – having positive relationships with others and feel a part of the school

Fun – Engagement in Learning – actively participating in class and finding ways that you learn the best

TIP OF THE WEEK

Q. How do I cancel food orders that have already been paid for?

A. To cancel a food order from your itemized eReceipt:

1. Open Qkr! and tap Activity.
2. Scroll down to 'Order History' and sign in with your password.
3. Tap the red circle with a minus symbol on the order to be cancelled. Select the entire order or individual items to cancel and tap 'OK'.
4. If your eReceipt contains food orders for more than one child, you will need to cancel one by one.


OR

To cancel a food order from the calendar view:

1. Open Qkr! and select the relevant menu.
2. Tap on the tick icon on the date for which you want to cancel the order.
3. Tap the red circle with a minus symbol on the order to be cancelled. Select the entire order or individual items to cancel and tap 'OK'.

Cancelled items are shown in red on your eReceipt confirming they have been cancelled and a credit is available for future food orders. The value of any credits will be automatically deducted from your next Qkr! food order.

Please contact your school office to cancel any other (non-food) school payments according to school policy.

The Premier Reading Challenge has begun and will finish on the **9th September**.


Please could you encourage your children to participate.

APPLYING FOR A SCHOOL CARD



All types of School Card applications are now online.

You can access the online forms from any device that gets internet, including mobile devices, such as tablets and smart phones, as well as laptops and computers.

Applying online is easy! Simply follow the steps below.

- STEP 1** Visit sa.gov.au/education/schoolcard
- STEP 2** Select the type of School Card you would like to apply for (for example 'Type A') and follow the prompts.
- STEP 3** Complete all mandatory fields.
Please note: you cannot submit your application unless all mandatory fields are complete.
- STEP 4** Once you have completed a page click on the 'NEXT' button.
- STEP 5** Once you have filled out all pages click the 'SUBMIT' button.
Please note: if you exit the form without clicking 'SUBMIT' your details will be lost.

You can save the form, and return to complete it at another time, by clicking on the 'SAVE' button.


