### Tournament of the Minds

Three groups of Year 5/6 students spent 6 weeks preparing for their Tournament of the Minds (TOM) challenge. All groups chose to participate in the STEM challenge this year. They worked well together to create scripts, props, and devices to meet their challenge. Many families and teachers came out to support them on presentation day. All of the teams did a fantastic job and two of the teams received honours. Congratulations to all the TOM participants for their hard work and dedication.

### Festival of Music Choir

Twenty Year 5/6 students travelled to Adelaide to perform on stage at the Festival Theatre as part of the Festival of Music. They sang in a choir alongside nearly 400 other students from across South Australia. It was an incredible evening and we are very proud of all our choristers.



### Northern Festival of Music Guest Artists

Matthew will be playing the piano, while the Taiko Drummers will perform their Taiko pieces and have also been collaborating with the Northern Festival conductor to learn a new song, which they will perform with the choir that evening. ### Maths Olympiad

Over the past three terms, nearly 100 students have taken part in the Maths Olympiad program. They train every two weeks, working together to explore a range of strategies for tackling challenging math problems. This week, students participated in their final Maths Olympiad competition. Congratulations to them for their persistence and determination throughout the year.

### Junior Primary Strings Program

This term, our Year 1 students had their very first Junior Primary (JP) strings concert. JP Strings is a special program we started at The Pines School this year. After receiving a generous grant from Variety, the Children's Charity, we purchased 70 small violins and cellos for our Preschool, Reception and Year 1 students. Once a week, each class has a lesson, then as a class practise together 3 times a week. The students learn about their instruments and how to play them by singing rhymes and songs, and playing games that develop knowledge about beat, rhythm and music making. This program was started based on research about the benefits learning music has on brain development, especially for children under 7 years of age. It was wonderful to watch our Year 1 students confidently performing in front of their families and some special quests. Congratulations and keep up the great work.


